

John Hourihan from the Kingaroy would enlist for the first time in the AIF on the 10<sup>th</sup> November 1914 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Lighthorse Field Ambulance.

There is some confusion as he appears to have somehow after a period of time re-enlisted on the 15<sup>th</sup> August 1916.

His records are somewhat vague as they are confused as to his 2 enlistments.

It may be that his initial enlistment did not occur and he followed up a second time.

It may be that he even waited and re-enlisted to be with his brother James as they left together on the 23<sup>rd</sup> December 1916.

It also appears that he was in the 18<sup>th</sup> Reinforcements 26<sup>th</sup> Battalion in this second enlistment detail. ( the same as James)

The official records have them both leaving Brisbane on the 23<sup>rd</sup> December 1916 and arriving in England on the 3 March 1917.

John and James took part in training in in the 7<sup>th</sup> Training Batallion at Rollingstone and then proceeded overseas.

Training as such and then arriving in France and taking part in action of the 26<sup>th</sup> Battalion and transferred to the Australian Employment Company some time later after shellshock.

He was in the Field in France on the 9th July 1917.

The 7th Brigade proceeded to France as part of the 2nd Australian Division in March 1916 In concert with the 28th Battalion, the 26th mounted the first trench raid undertaken by Australian troops on the Western Front on 6 June. The Battalion fought in its first major battle around Pozieres between 28 July and 7 August 1916.. After a short spell in Belgium, the 2nd Division came south later in the year to attack again in the Somme Valley. The 26th Battalion took part in two attacks to the east of Flers, both of which floundered in mud and slush.

It would appear from records that in November he was transferred to hospital with Shell Shock suffering the injuries around Steenvorde.

John was probably involved in action at Pozieres in July and August.

Then he was next in Belgium during September and October and November. He may even have been witness to his brother James Francis Hourihan's death and being missing sometime around the 15<sup>th</sup> September at Westhoek Ridge and the Battle of the Menin Road.

John would be part of The Battle of Broodseind Ridge where Australian Battalions suffered 6500 casualties.

John would be sent to hospital after suffering shellshock and terrible gassing on the 6<sup>th</sup> November 1917. Spending time in hospital probably at Etaples and then returning to service in the Australian Employment Company. These companies would provide services behind the lines made up of men who were not fit for active service. He would serve out the war with ongoing Shellshock eventually being repatriated back to Australia on the 7<sup>th</sup> February 1919.

John's war was over but the terrible memories would haunt him For his life. Family members attesting to the struggles that he underwent.


